isruptive innovation is described as an "innovation that transforms an existing market or sector by introducing simplicity, convenience, accessibility, and affordability where complication and high cost are the status quo." Within the healthcare arena, as more is known about causality, treatment and predicted outcomes, care can be provided in less specialized venues by generalists and community-based clinicians, thus disrupting the status quo.

Both the Affordable Care Act (ACA) and the Institute of Medicine's "Future of Nursing Report: Leading Change, Advancing Health" call on all nurses to practice to the full extent of their education and training. Nurses from across the spectrum of practice, from staff nurses to advanced practice nurses, from generalists to specialists, must incorporate emerging knowledge, evidence, skills and technology in order to ensure that the profession capitalizes on the strength of its members to meet the healthcare needs of the future.

As we strive to expand our practice to the fullest, the status quo must change, resulting in both higher quality patient care and more advanced nursing practice. This creates the opportunity for disruption within the profession and the entire healthcare system. The nursing profession as a whole will be pushed, pulled and redefined as new science, skills and technology emerge and as other disciplines such as physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech and language, pharmacy and social work strive to practice at their fullest extent as well. This in turn will create both challenges and opportunities for nurses. What new healthcare models and nursing roles will emerge as health policy, science, predictive modeling and technology enable ever more advancements in care and care delivery models?

Please join us at the ONL NJ annual meeting to explore the meaning of disruptive innovation and how it can expand nursing practice from the status quo to nurses practicing to the full extent of their education and training.
