OVERVIEW:

In a dramatic turn of events, efforts by Congress to repeal the Affordable Care Act collapsed when the American Health Care Act failed to produce enough votes to pass in the House. While the ACA will remain in place for now, there remains uncertainty about what other options Congress and the White House may exercise to chip away at the fabric of the ACA and erode support for state Medicaid programs. The failed legislation provided some insight into structural changes Congress was considering to federal funding for state Medicaid programs. Specifically, the AHCA proposed reducing federal support for state Medicaid programs by \$880 billion over 10 years. House leaders stipulated that the AHCA was only the first step in a three-pronged approach. The dynamic in Washington hasn't changed, leaving on the table many of the concepts to weaken the ACA.

This program, originally designed to focus on the Block Grant/Per Capita Cap funding of state Medicaid programs, has been refocused on the options available to Congress, the Department of Health and Human Services and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to undermine the ACA, rein in federal support of state Medicaid programs and how providers can best prepare for the uncertain future. Block grant funding, along with other programmatic revisions, remains an option for states via the waiver process. This program will help identify what providers need to know and how they can best prepare for an uncertain future.

OBJECTIVES:

- Understand the options available to Congress and the Administration to erode the ACA
- Learn the impact that block grants or per capita caps could have on healthcare in New Jersey
- Identify options that state Medicaid directors and governors may choose to initiate through waiver requests
- Hear in real-time from a former government official living under a block grant model
