TRANSPORTATION

The Hyatt Regency Austin is located in the heart of downtown and there are plenty of transportation options in the city.

Directions from Austin Bergstrom International Airport:

- 1. Exit airport on Presidential Boulevard;
- 2. Turn left on TX-71;

- 4. Turn right on Barton Springs Road; and

TAXI

Taxi transportation to and from the Hyatt Regency Austin is approximately \$20 - \$27 for one passenger. Taxi transport to the Amtrak station is approximately \$5 (1.5 miles).

AIRPORT SUPER SHUTTLE

NIGHTLIFE

Every city has its legendary mainstays, and Austin is no exception. Check out this list of music venues ranging from classic country to blues to rock.

Broken Spoke

The dance hall is internationally known as an authentic honkytonk with Willie Nelson, George Straight and Dolly Parton as past performers.

Continental Club

The retro Austin relic opened in 1957 as a swanky private supper club, but in the decades since, it's transformed into a mecca for roots, rockabilly, country and swing music.

Elephant Room

Open since 1991, this jazz club is a cozy and intimate basement venue featuring live music every day of the week. Shows begin at approximately 9:30 p.m.

The Mohawk

Referring to the Native American tribe - not the hairstyle - Mohawk opened in 2006 as a place to showcase the best emerging talent in the indie music scene.

Rattle Inn

Asleep at the Wheel leader Ray Benson's spacious Rattle Inn is a great place to catch Latin, country and folk music any day of the week.

RESTAURANTS

Austin is home to a wide array of top-rated eateries. Whether you're in the mood for Tex-Mex, southern comfort or barbecue, there's a restaurant to satisfy any craving.

Barley Swine

This eclectic menu features refined techniques juxtaposed with rustic ingredients sourced from local farms

East Side King

The original East Side King, the Asian-style street food truck chain from Top Chef winner Paul Qui, offers new classics like Brussels sprouts, chicken karaage and fried beets.

Franklin Barbecue

The brick-and-mortar location of Aaron Franklin's beloved barbecue truck produces what has quickly become one of Texas's, if not the country's, most talked-about barbecue.

Gourdough's Specialty Donuts

This donut-centric eatery is housed in a vintage airstream trailer, and serves up delectable and crazy donut concoctions such as fried chicken with honey butter, and grilled bananas and brown sugar.

Hula Hut

Tex-Mex meets Caribbean at this local favorite overlooking Lake Austin. The unique Tiki-Mex cuisine features dishes like coconut fried shrimp, Hawaiian fajitas and mango-poblano chile quesadillas.

La Condesa

In the heart of downtown, La Condesa serves modern Mexican food like ceviche, tortas and tacos. They also are known for their wide delectable list of desserts.

Matt's is an Austin institution thanks to its Bob Armstrong dip, affordable prices and dedication to classic Tex-Mex

Torchy's Tacos

Looking for the perfect taco? Torchy's features unique taco options including salmon, fried avocado and the always popular taco of the month

Located in the trendy neighborhood on South Lamar, this highly respected contemporary Japanese dining and sushi restaurant is best known for the infamous Shag Roll.
