

New Jersey 2015 Sepsis Learning – Action Collaborative

CURRENT COLLABORATIVE NEWS

On April 15, the NJ Sepsis Learning Action Collaborative's monthly webinar was led by our project faculty, Dr. Phillip Dellinger and Christa Schorr, RN. Many topics were covered including the use of central venous pressure (CVP) measurements in severely septic patients and best practices to manage fluid resuscitation in patients with hypotension from septic shock. Dr. Dellinger and Christa used case studies to illustrate how teams can integrate the 3- and 6-hour bundle care components into their clinical practice.

In addition to a lively discussion of clinical care, Dr. Dellinger and Christa provided an overview of the newly released Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) Severe Sepsis and Septic Shock measure that hospitals will be required to collect starting in October. While the bundle measures are in alignment with the Surviving Sepsis Campaigns 3- and 6-hour bundles, there are some data points that will require clarification. Our collaborative will continue to focus on the 3-hour bundle, but will align our patient population to that which CMS will require hospitals to sample from.
