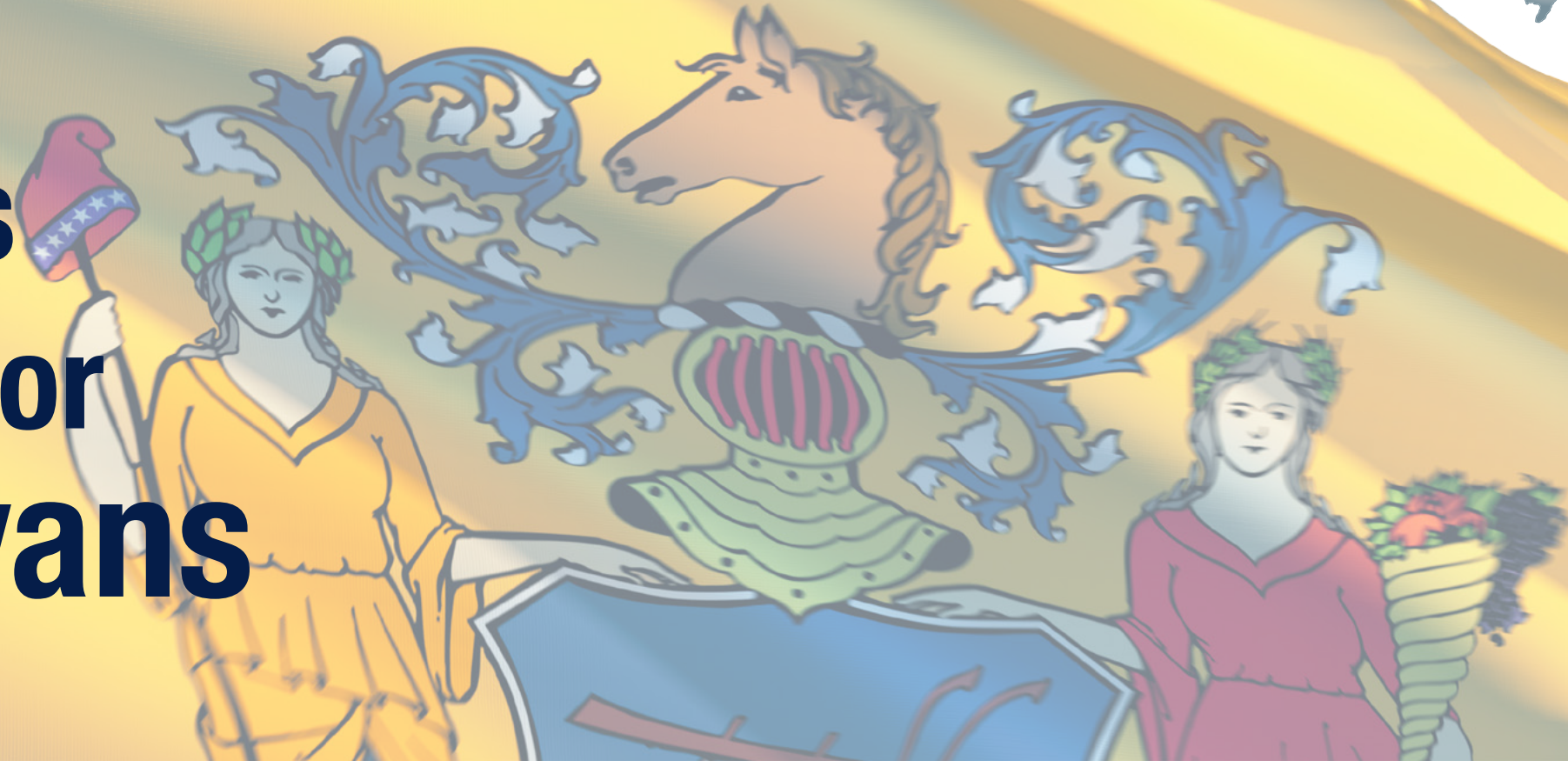


# Healthcare Coverage is Important for New Jerseyans



**94%**

of all New Jerseyans now have healthcare coverage

Nearly **1.8 million** New Jerseyans depend on Medicaid for access to healthcare.

Close to **550,000** New Jerseyans received coverage from Medicaid expansion.

**250,000** residents have gained coverage through the marketplace.

The uninsured rate fell from

**15%**

to

**6%.**

The Medicaid financing changes in the proposed AHCA could cost N.J. hospitals at least **\$1 billion** a year.
