MARCH 11: Session I – Deep Dive into Operational Definitions for Labor, Induction and Augmentation

Our system is perfectly designed to achieve the results it achieves. In women who have never given birth, an opportunity exists to improve their health by improving the structures and processes in place for pregnancy care. This Webinar series will study and dive deep into operational definitions for labor, induction and augmentation. Participants will link their system results to the findings from the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development Preventing the First Cesarean Summit.

Objectives:

- 1. Discusses the diagnosis of active labor and recent recommendations.
- 2. Describes the operational definitions of labor, induction and augmentation and share how these definitions are applied pragmatically to women who received care in your organization.
- 3. Identifies the largest opportunity to improve vaginal birth rates in your organization-labor arrest or nonreassuring fetal heart rate.

MAY 27: Session II – Importance of Data and Setting Measureable Goals

It is important to measure if you want to improve. Breaking down your PC-02 data (data is a patient), what story did you uncover and can you share it with your colleagues? The second webinar will focus on identifying opportunities across hospitals to develop a focus and aim for this year.

Objectives:

- 1. Describes the importance of measurement in improvement.
- 2. Discusses findings across hospitals to identify the largest category of nulliparous cesareans and develop a shared aim for New Jersey hospitals.

JUNE 24: Session III – Putting Planning into Action

What does your system tell you? What is modifiable? According to the Preventing the First Birth Cesarean Summit, labor arrest accounts for 34 percent of nulliparous cesareans. If we renewed our focus on Keeping Normal *Normal* and supported spontaneous labor as reliably as an intervention focused labor, would your L&D unit daily activities be different?

Objectives:

- 1. Discusses the sources of variation in practice and outcomes in your organization.
- 2. Develops an organizational work plan to improve the vaginal birth rate in your organization.
- 3. Understands the impact to cost and quality with the overuse of interventions and the underuse of normal.
