Research shows that the rate of hospital-acquired infections (HAIs) in long term care facility (LTCF) residents is between one and three million annually in the United States. This contributes to nearly 400,000 deaths per year. In addition, re-hospitalizations from LTCFs are increasing, with urinary tract infections being the second most common reason. This program emphasizes evidence-based infection prevention practices and antibiotic stewardship to help eliminate catheter-associated urinary tract infections (CAUTIs).

- 2. Understands steps necessary to reduce the utilization of urinary catheters and decrease CAUTI rates
- 3. Describes how the culture of resident safety can influence the outcomes of infection prevention
