OVERVIEW:

Adverse drug events (ADEs) result in more than 770,000 injuries and deaths per year at the insurmountable cost of \$5.6 million per hospital depending on size. Many ADE injuries and resulting hospital costs can be reduced if hospitals make changes to their systems for preventing and detecting ADEs. Adverse drug events among outpatients that lead to emergency department visits are an important cause for morbidity in the United States, particularly among individuals age 65 and older. Insulin and warfarin have been implicated in more than one-quarter of all estimated hospitalizations, and among individuals 65 years or older, insulin, warfarin and digoxin were implicated in one in every three estimated ADEs treated in emergency departments.

This program will provide insight into the identification and avoidance of medication errors, focusing on a proactive approach to improving medication safety in health systems. Recent focus on the problematic issues associated with the use of drugs in this “high-alert” category has led to the identification of several areas for improvement.

OBJECTIVES:

1. Understands the frequency of adverse drug events associated with anticoagulants, anti-diabetic drugs and opioids
2. Describes opportunities to improve the safe use of opioid analgesics in the inpatient setting
3. Evaluates methods to reduce insulin errors and adverse effects
4. Describes the management and safe use of warfarin anticoagulation
5. Discusses the impact of an antimicrobial stewardship program.
