OVERVIEW:

When Congress passed the HITECH Act, a key healthcare sector was missing -- long term and post-acute care providers were noticeably missing from receiving electronic health record (EHR) funding. Considering the amount of patient clinical information housed at each facility and the number of chronic conditions many long term and post-acute patients have, the need to electronically store and share information with hospitals, physicians and other providers is critically important.

Due to the lack of federal funding support, many long term care and post-acute providers do not have an EHR that would enable them to share information outside their facilities. Yet they are in need of the electronic information that is available from other healthcare sectors that can make this information available.

This program will explore the options available to long term care and post-acute providers for partnering with regional health information exchange (HIE) organizations to access clinical information for their patients who have been treated in other settings where an EHR was capable of sharing.

The six New Jersey regional HIEs will present what they can offer providers in their area, regardless of whether they have an EHR or not. Most HIEs offer membership options to long term care and post-acute providers along with various ways to connect with or without an EHR. Most HIEs offer view-only portal access to view patient information online to better understand the care the patient received externally along with important transition of care information for patients being admitted or returning to the long term care or post-acute setting.

This program will give providers a good understanding of what the regional HIE can offer with respect to the clinical content/data from contributing providers, as well as contributing provider data sharing limitations. It also will cover the progress these HIE organizations have made in connecting patient information from hospitals, physicians, clinics and long term care and post-acute providers in the communities they serve.

OBJECTIVES:

1. Explore the options available to long term care and post-acute providers for partnering with regional health information exchange (HIE) organizations to access clinical information for their patients
2. Describe two New Jersey regional health information exchange models
3. Understand what the regional HIE can offer with respect to the clinical content and data from contributing providers, as well as contributing provider data-sharing limitations.
