OVERVIEW:

Lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) individuals often face health challenges and barriers to accessing needed health services. An individual's sexual orientation or gender identity has been identified as the underlying factors for stigma, discrimination and care inequity.

Several recent policy changes are at the forefront of reform aimed at increasing access to care and insurance for LGBT individuals and their families. Most notably, the implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) and steps taken by the Obama Administration to promote equal treatment of LGBT people and same-sex couples in the nation's healthcare system have helped to move forward policy affecting this patient population. The ACA expands access to health insurance coverage and includes specific protections related to sexual orientation and gender identity. The purpose of this educational event is to provide: an update on the Final Rule implementing Section 1557 of the ACA; insight into provider responsibilities; necessary practice changes; and recognition of promising practices for improving access to care. With an agenda that serves as a backdrop for strategic initiatives at the provider level, this event brings together the industry's leading experts on this topic.

- ➤ Describe three requirements of providers under the Final Rule for Section 1557.
- ➤ Discuss how New Jersey hospitals have pursued efforts to strengthen equity of care and inclusion of LGBT patients and employees in their model of care.
