- The [first settlement alleges that Visa and MasterCard](#) violated the law by setting interchange fees (charged to businesses every time a customer pays with a Visa or MasterCard) and then made and enforced rules that prohibited merchants from steering customers to other payment methods, resulting in hospitals paying excessive fees to accept payment from Visa and MasterCard credit or debit cards.
- The second settlement addresses the higher prices paid by individuals and entities for [Traditional Blood Reagents](#).
- The third settlement addresses overcharges on [Lithium-Ion Batteries](#) (rechargeable batteries), a product that hospitals buy in abundance.

Class Action Capital's fee is a percentage of your financial recovery. Claim forms are not yet available from the Class Administrator. When claim forms do become available, class members are not required to sign up with any third-party service in order to participate in the monetary relief, but may instead file their claim directly with the Class Administrator. The claim form will inform most class members of their actual or estimated interchange fees on which it is proposed their claims will be paid. Claimants may accept or dispute this estimate with the opportunity to submit additional information. No-cost assistance will be available from the Class Administrator and Class Counsel during the claims-filing period.
