- 2. Enhance sensitivity to the prevalence of mental disorders in adolescent development, resiliency, and the spectrum of interventions.
- 3. Raise confidence to intervene and assist individuals experiencing a mental health issue by using a Mental Health First Aid Action Plan.

Learner Outcome:

After successfully completing the course, the learner will identify two potential risk factors and warning signs of a variety of mental health challenges common among adolescents, including anxiety, depression, psychosis, eating disorders, AD/HD, and substance use disorder.

Successful completion of the course is defined as in-person attendance for 95% of the didactic learning session and a completed course evaluation.
