OVERVIEW:

New Jersey has had a mandatory universal transfer form (UTF) since 2011 under N.J.A.C. 8:43E, Subchapter 13. The product of testing and development by the field and the New Jersey Department of Health, the UTF originated as a tool designed to enhance and improve safety and the sharing of essential information at the time of transfer or discharge. This webinar will provide a review of the UTF, including the Department of Health's expectations concerning its use. Discussion of ways to improve the UTF will also be included.

OBJECTIVES:

- To understand the purpose and rationale behind the UTF
- To learn how to properly use the UTF as a patient safety tool
- To dispel common misconceptions about the UTF
- To understand how the DOH evaluates use of the UTF
