OVERVIEW:

Essential to the success of today's nurse leaders, and aspiring nurse leaders, is the comprehensive understanding of all the elements that contribute to a healthy nurse work environment.

Improving the nursing work environment has become a worldwide issue and is a key goal of ONL NJ. An extensive body of evidence confirms the relationships among positive work environments, positive nurse outcomes of job satisfaction and retention and positive patient outcomes.

Many variables influence workplace environments and staffing resources such as financial management of staffing resources, legislation for mandated staffing and research on staffing ratios. This education program will examine the American Association of Critical Care Nurses (AACN) Standards for Establishing and Sustaining Health Work Environments and the variables that go into supporting the model.

The task of improving hospital nursing work environments rests primarily with the hospitals themselves.

LEARNER OUTCOME:

After successfully completing the course, the learner will identify two variables that influence the workplace environment and staffing resources, which may be transferrable to their organization.

Successful completion of the course is defined as in-person attendance for 95 percent of the didactic learning session and a completed course evaluation.
