Overview:

Patient and Family Advisory Councils (PFACs) are invaluable resources for hospitals that can; enhance the quality and safety of care, strengthen community relationships and enhance a hospital's reputation, improve the patient experience as reflected in Hospital Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (HCAHPS) scores and improve job satisfaction for staff and clinicians. This boot camp is intended to assist hospital staff who are responsible for implementing a PFAC. This seven-hour working session is designed to facilitate hands-on, step-by-step planning, resulting in a completed work plan for taking the necessary steps to begin implementing a PFAC. Participants will work together to assess a hospital's readiness, develop plans for creating buy-in across the hospital, identify and select patient and family advisors, and begin the process of preparing both the hospital and the advisors for effective advisory council operations.

Objective:

- To accurately assess hospital needs surrounding implementation of PFAC
- To establish a specific and detailed plan of action for implementing patient and family advisors and/or a PFAC
- To increase awareness and ability to adapt and use existing tools for implementation of PFAC

Learner Outcome:

The learner will have a comprehensive understanding of metric four and of how to implement a PFAC based on hospital needs assessment. The learner will be able to list two existing tools for implementation of a PFAC, transferrable to their organization.

*Successful completion of the course is defined as in-person attendance for 95 percent of the didactic learning session and a complete course evaluation.

Healthcare administrators, quality managers, patient advocates, registered nursed, chaplains, post-acute facilities and rehabilitation healthcare providers.
