### **OVERVIEW**

s healthcare's rapid pace of change continues, it is imperative that new models of care incorporate a broad understanding of care coordination and transition management across the continuum. Nurses are well positioned to coordinate and deliver these services to patients.

Care coordination and transition management roles are needed to support achievement of the Triple Aim: improving quality of care to individuals, improving the health of communities and simultaneously reducing costs. Comprehensive strategies are needed to assure patients and families experience seamless care provided by interprofessional care teams across healthcare settings. Strong leadership is needed to strategically drive innovation and inspire transformative change in a complex healthcare environment. The role of the nurse leader is to advocate the value of nursing in care coordination and transition management.

A new joint statement from AONE and the American Academy of Ambulatory Care Nursing (AAACN) released in September 2015 which examines the role of the nurse in care coordination and transition management. The joint statement outlines how nurse leaders in inpatient and post-acute/outpatient settings should approach their roles to enhance development of care coordination and transition management across the continuum of care. Nurse leaders can activate interprofessional collaboration and innovation through adoption and engagement in the following strategies. These six principles provide a basis for establishing an informed and collaborative care coordination process that includes all staff, key stakeholders and nurse leaders across the continuum of care.

- 1. Know how care is coordinated in your setting.
- 2. Know who is providing care.
- 3. Establish relationships with multiple entities and individuals who can work together to improve care coordination and transition management systems.
- 4. Know the value of technology, its impact on workflow and the roles of care coordination team members.
- 5. Engage the patient and family.
- 6. Engage all team members in care coordination.

As we strive to build an even greater understanding of the best ways to transform care and educate the workforce to perform even more efficiently and effectively in the future, we need to recalibrate the working foundation for how leaders should nurture the process for innovation among care teams and transform care across the continuum of care.

Please join us at the "Innovations Across the Care Continuum" program to explore some of the unique innovations and opportunities that New Jersey hospitals and health systems have successfully implemented to improve transitions of care.
