## **OVERVIEW:**

Join us for a two-part webinar series on the latest evidenced-based information for the management of pediatric sepsis.

The resolution on sepsis by the United Nations World Health Assembly in May 2017 recognizes sepsis as a global threat in adults and children and a priority for the World Health Organization to address during the next decade. This resolution on sepsis acknowledges that sepsis represents a major contributor to childhood morbidity and mortality and the associated economic burden. The United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 3 (<a href="https://sustainabledevelopment.un.org/sdg3">https://sustainabledevelopment.un.org/sdg3</a>) defined specific targets for infections and pandemics. Despite the huge burden that sepsis imposes on the health of children, are current definitions of pediatric sepsis are of limited value to bedside clinicians to identify cases of sepsis affecting early identification and treatment. We bring this 2-part webinar series to continue the conversation on how we can improve on identifying, treating, and monitoring the septic child in a timely manner.
