Quality Improvement and clinical professionals are invited to take part in the New Jersey Hospital Improvement Innovation Network's Ventilator-Associated Event (VAE) ALERT program, beginning this week. This program focuses on reducing VAE rates by using a combination of approaches to ventilator care practices, implementing improvement tools, executing test of changes and sustaining best practices.

Participants of the VAE ALERT program are expected to review the VAE ALERT Toolkit, complete the VAE ALERT assessment, and based on the assessment findings, develop and implement an improvement plan to address gaps in their VAE prevention program.

More than a quarter million patients in the United States receive mechanical ventilation each year, putting them at risk for acute lung injury. In 2011, nearly 50,000 patients developed ventilator-associated pneumonia during the course of their acute care hospital stay and 157,000 patients were diagnosed with health care-associated pneumonia. It is estimated that a ventilator-associated pneumonia diagnosis costs an additional \$41,000 and leads to a 14-day increase in length of stay for acute care hospital patients.
