

THE BODY'S OVERWHELMING RESPONSE TO INFECTION WHICH CAN LEAD TO TISSUE DAMAGE, ORGAN FAILURE AND DEATH

TREATMENT

SEPSIS IS A MEDICAL EMERGENCY THAT REQUIRES URGENT ATTENTION AND RAPID TREATMENT FOR SURVIVAL, SEPSIS CAN BE TREATED AND, IN MANY INSTANCES, LIVES ARE SAVED BY USING EXISTING AND PROVEN PROTOCOLS.

SYMPTOMS

- S SHIVERING, FEVER OR VERY COLD
- E EXTREME PAIN OR GENERAL DISCOMFORT (WORST EVER)
- P PALE OR DISCOLORED SKIN
- S SLEEPY, DIFFICULT TO ROUSE, CONFUSED
- I "I FEEL LIKE I MIGHT DIE"
- S SHORTNESS OF BREATH

SEPSIS

IS THE LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH IN U.S. HOSPITALS

MORTALITY

MORTALITY FROM SEPSIS INCREASES BY AS **MUCH AS 8% FOR EVERY HOUR THAT** TREATMENT IS DELAYED. AS MANY AS 80% OF SEPSIS DEATHS COULD BE PREVENTED WITH RAPID DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT
