
N.J. Hospitals CARING for Their Communities 2020 Community Benefit Report*

Data reflects the unpaid costs incurred by acute care hospitals statewide in calendar year 2018. Charity care shortfall reflects CY 2014 documented costs and state fiscal year 2018 (July 2017 – June 2018) subsidy data. Unpaid cost of Medicaid and Medicare are based on Uniform Billing discharge data for CY 2018 and represent only the inpatient fee-for-service populations.

² Data represents statewide estimates extrapolated from data submitted to NJHA/HRET by 51 acute care nonprofit hospitals (88% response rate). The extrapolation procedure was based on licensed beds, calculated by dividing the number for each data element by the total number of licensed beds in the 51 reporting hospitals and multiplying by the total number of nonprofit beds statewide.

³ # of Programs and Persons Served may be undercounted, as not all hospitals track this data.

^{4 &}quot;Community-Building Activities" include physical improvements/housing, economic development, community support, environmental improvements, leadership development/training for community members, coalition building, community health improvement advocacy, workforce development, etc.
